

Routine Maintenance

Every Trip

- ☐ Check tires and tire pressure
- ☐ Check roof for debris
- ☐ Check lights when hooked up: emergency flashers
- ☐ Keep an eye on all hookup locations: chains, 7-pin, ball, swaybars, etc.

Every Three Months

Check all the breaches in the roof and other surfaces for drying or cracking.

Check your owner's manual or check with the manufacturer to learn what materials to use on the seals.

- ☐ Marker lights
- ☐ Windows and Doors (including baggage doors)
- ☐ Vent openings for heaters, refrigerator, etc.
- ☐ Below decks - chassis, axles, tanks, etc.

Appliances and Water Systems

- ☐ Open appliance access ports and check for bugs and rodents; clean out debris
- ☐ Remove and clean the air conditioner's inside filters
- ☐ Disinfect/sanitize fresh water tank

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- ☐ Batteries: check water if flooded batteries

Seasonally (beginning and end of camp season, if relevant)

Winterizing

- ☐ Low-point drain
- ☐ Valves on the water heater
- ☐ Compressed air or antifreeze
- ☐ P-traps
- ☐ Gasket oil on toilet seal

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- ☐ Check anode rod in the water heater and replace as needed

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- ☐ Battery protection

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- ☐ Check for entry points: turn on lights and go outside

- Grandpa Gus: Great way to keep rodents out of your RV

De-winterizing: run plenty of water through system to completely remove antifreeze

Annually

- ☐ Have tires, bearings, brakes, axles, etc. checked and maintained
